Well done to all the boys who competed in the second Kent League meet of the season. We welcomed more debuts, clocked up PBs, and showed real team spirit despite the chilly, windy conditions. The U13 boys stormed to 1st place, finishing 19 points ahead of Dartford Harriers, and the overall Lower Age Group team took top spot with 611 points to Dartford's 553 (provisional scores pending verification).

Hurdles - We opened the track with the 75m hurdles:

- Freddie ran a strong 13.4s, just shy of his PB, placing 3rd in the A string.
- Drew, in fine form, improved on his YDL debut to finish 2nd in the B string with a new PB of 15.9s – brilliant effort!
- Emery, making his Kent League hurdles debut, took 1st place in the non-scoring race with an impressive 15.3s.

#### Sprints - Starting with the 100m:

- Rohan finished 2nd in the A string with a sharp 13.3s in a tight finish.
- Carter stormed to 3rd in the B string, clocking a rapid 14.0s.
- Drew, doubling up with confidence, ran a non-scoring 100m and smashed out a second PB of the day – 14.0s flat. Superb running!

#### In the 200m:

- Jonathan powered to a commanding 1st in the A string with a slick 26.8.
- Lewis, making his 200m debut in a strong field, came 4th in the B string in 29.7.
- Anthony won his non-scoring race comfortably in 29.0s, two seconds ahead of the pack.

#### 1K Walk

Ethan showed impressive determination in his first-ever fast walking race. After just one coaching session the day before, he held his form and pace superbly to finish 3rd in 6:19.4 a fantastic debut and a testament to his focus and adaptability.

### Middle Distance

- In the 800m, the boys showed real determination and resilience:
- Luc made a confident return from a broken toe injury, pacing himself well in the A string to finish with a strong 2:30.5 – a great step back into form.
- Akul, making his Kent League debut, impressed with a composed run to take 2nd place in the B string in 2:29.1 – a brilliant start to his track season.
- Haydn, also debuting for both the club and the Kent League, ran a commendable 2:45.1 in the non-scoring race – plenty of promise shown.

## Jumps - Long Jump:

- Freddie landed 1st in the A string with a 4.10m jump.
- Emery, making his KYAL debut in the event, secured 1st in the B string with a 3.93m PB. A brilliant double victory and double PBs!

High Jump:

- Freddie, looking relaxed and enjoying his day of jumps, cleared 1.30m to finish joint 1st in the A string.
- Lewis, showing great versatility, stepped up for his HJ debut and cleared 1.10m to earn 2nd in the B string impressive after just one midweek session!

#### Throws - Shot Put:

- Daniel, a new addition to the team, made a confident debut with a 7.85m PB, winning the A string.
- Oscar recovered well from a nervy start to take 2nd in the B string with 6.29m great composure and progress.

#### Discus:

Alex, in his debut, earned valuable points with a 3rd place finish and a PB of 13.83m.

#### Javelin:

- Alex again impressed, throwing a new PB of 19.63m to take 4th in the A string.
- Ethan added a huge 4m to his PB with a 17.66m effort, finishing 2nd in the B string a brilliant jump in performance.
- Daniel, having already made an impact in the shot put, stepped up again for his javelin debut in a non-scoring slot and launched a fantastic 17.07m. A great start to his throwing career with the club!

### Relay

- We ended the day on a high with an electrifying 4x100m:
  - The team of Carter, Oscar, Rohan, and Jonathan stormed to 2nd place in 52.20s, just
     0.2s behind 1st. Carter got us off to a flying start, and Jonathan's turbo-charged anchor leg nearly clinched the win. The time shaved 0.21s off our previous YDL run great to see that practice paying off!

 A huge well done to everyone – especially those trying new events, stepping up last minute, or making their Kent League and club debuts. The team spirit, adaptability, and determination on display made us all incredibly proud.
