The team won the event with a total of 663 points , some 118 ahead of second place, Harrow. Well done all – what a fantastic start to the 2025 season!





The first league match of the season marks a changing of the guard with old faces absent, having moved on to older things, and new faces in abundance (hopefully).



This was very much the case at Norman Park on Sunday. Although the team was somewhat depleted by the mini-marathon, Duke of Edinburgh, late season hockey and rugby and it simply being too soon for some to dust off their spikes, those who did turn out were rewarded by almost perfect conditions and some very encouraging performances. The boys began their day with a League record and, although we had to wait an hour or two, 'new face' **Izzy Rae** made honours even with a sparkling display in the U17 sprint hurdles for a new league record of 11.17. The Club record of 11.10 held by **Serita Solomon** looks under threat. Other UAG first-timers making their mark in the U17s were **Emilia Adese**, **Florence Holman, Jackie Nzekwe** and **Luna Corry** (with wins in



the A shot and javelin and B discus and PV respectively) and **Sophie Tran** in the (B 300), while there were further U17 wins from 'older stagers' **Cheyanne Nketia** (A 100), **Elsa Pawson** (A PV), **Ella Reece** (B shot and A discus) and both relay teams: 4x100 (**Chizam Boniface, Cheyanne Nketia, Poppy Ellis-Jones** and, debutante from Newquay, **Nevie Tamblyn**) and 4x300 (**Leah Kyriacou, Sophie Tran, Luciana Smith** and **Alice Witherspoon**).

The U20s also had plenty to celebrate with new members again leading the way: **Sophie Osborn** won the A 400 (with **Alyssa Firla** winning the B) and **Gracelyn Kendeck** winning the B 400H (in a time that would have won the A string with a more perceptive team manager!). **Qi-Chi Ukpai** won the HJ (and was runner up in the LJ) and U17 **Aida Palomares-Domingue** proved that you have to be in it to win it in the B S/C.

Many other names featured in the podium places enabling us, with a little help from the boys (and not forgetting the officials points), to record an emphatic victory. With the potential to field a stronger team at the next match on 25th May, we are exactly where we want to be.

#### U17 & U20 Men – Competition Report

Our amazing U17 and U20 Men's team delivered a dominant performance to take a huge team win, overcoming some of the most prestigious clubs from across the South of England.

From sprint relays to endurance events, jumps to throws, every part of the team contributed superbly to a comprehensive victory — underlining both the depth and spirit of this talented squad. And I know I'll have overlooked some great performances for which I apologise in advance.




Across a day packed with outstanding individual performances, there were several athletes who achieved English Schools' National Standards (so early in the season too!), while others stepped up heroically for the team when it mattered most.

# National Standards!

Amongst a superb set of performances, there were some that truly stood out headlined by a string of athletes achieving the prestigious English Schools' National Standards.

- **Rayhan Mourtada** was in sensational form, achieving National Standards in both the 110m Hurdles and 400m Hurdles, and breaking the YDL League Record with a brilliant 400mH winning time of 51.88 seconds.
- Ben O'Grady and Oliver Ward both achieved National Standard in the 1500m Steeplechase, winning the A and B string races respectively.
- Olivier Coulibaly achieved National Standards in three events! The Shot (15.13m), Discus (49.51m), and additionally threw a National Standard performance in the Hammer (51.84m) despite being it being a non-scoring event.



- **Aaron Axtell** dominated the Hammer A string, throwing a superb 53.94m to comfortably surpass the National Standard.
- **Oscar Witcombe** matched the National Standard exactly in the Pole Vault, clearing 4.40m for victory.

Other standout performances included:

- **Zuriel Nwogwugwu** produced a brilliant 400m win in 49.15 seconds, narrowly missing the U20 National Standard, before showing remarkable resilience to win the 200m just over an hour later.
- **Troy Ogendengbe** stepped up superbly to run the 100m, achieving a huge PB in an event he wasn't originally targeting, before winning his 200m heat, demonstrating terrific strength and flexibility for the team.
- Harry Fage and Jonathan Ellerton delivered a fantastic double in the U20 2000m Steeplechase, winning both A and B string races for maximum points.
- Alexander Giles made a huge contribution across multiple events, scoring valuable points in the 110m hurdles, Long Jump, and Discus, showcasing his versatility as a developing multi-eventer.
- Alexander D'Cruz, making his debut in the upper age group, showed great character to double up in the 400m hurdles and the flat 400m, scoring valuable points in both.
- **Chinedu Ndukwe** (Tony) had a brilliant day, winning the 110m hurdles B string, running a storming non-scoring 400m hurdles, and helping power the U20 4x100m relay.



- **Oji John Okoro** and **Abraham Sharif**, after the disappointment of DQs in their individual sprints, showed great character by bouncing back to help the team to a superb 2nd place finish in the U20 4x100m relay, alongside **Chinedu Ndukwe** and **Chiemerie Hemeson**.
- **Omari Anderson**, newly joined from a family with a proud B&B history, finished second in the U17 High Jump A string with a 1.75m clearance.
- Archie Powell set a personal best of 1.75m in the U20 High Jump A string to take second place.
- Madalisto Valema-Mwanza added crucial points with second place in the U17 High Jump B string.
- **Euan Lau,** called up only days before the match, took on the Long Jump outside his usual events and scored crucial points, before excelling in his main event, the Triple Jump, with a second-place A string finish.
- Our U17 middle-distance squad fresh from winning the London Mini Marathon team title the day before showed remarkable resilience and team spirit.
- Joseph Scanes and Joseph Hill both won the A and B string 800m, then anchored a strong second-place finish in the 4x400m relay.
- Other excellent performances included Joseph Scanes (800m, 1:55.71) and Micah Salmon (400m, 50.41), both narrowly missing National Standards but delivering topclass early season form.

The team spirit, resilience, and depth were evident throughout the day — setting the tone for an exciting YDL season ahead.

- 1500m: George De Bruyn ran a superb 5:09.55 on his Kent League debut, and Alex Coe followed closely with 5:17.50.
- 200m: **Calum Bryan** ran a new PB of 27.53s in the A string, with **Jonathan** finishing the B string in 27.36s.

Relay: The 4x100m team, made up of Carter, Oscar, Calum and Jonathan, put in a strong performance, finishing in 53.56s. With a bit more practice on handovers, they look set for even better results.

It was Evan's debut for Blackheath, and he certainly made an impact – a superb throw of over 10m secured him the  $2^{nd}$  in the A string!. He followed that up with another strong performance in the discus, winning the non-scoring string with a throw of 22.82m. A brilliant start to his season.

Oliver threw well too in the Shot put, just shy of the 10m mark to win the B string. He continued his strong form in the discus, holding his own to score 2<sup>nd</sup> in the B string, while **Aathi Gananathan** delivered an outstanding performance to win the A string throwing a new PB of 36.9m in discus - Amazing!

**Jack Ruby** was in top form in the high jump, clearing a new incredible outdoor PB of 1.73m to win the A string. He went straight from there to the javelin and threw over 33 metres – an excellent all-round performance.

# Mini Marathon 2025 – Sat 26th April (Ashley Pearson)

The Marathon weekend started with a bang with the Mini Marathon. One of the largest domestic junior events of the year, featuring the very best of the country's most talented youngsters. It has been a feature in the careers of all our current UK Track and road stars. Not always been winners of the MM – looked up Keely Hodgkinson, twice run in the MM as an U13 – finished 89 th , U17 – finished 42 nd , 18.19 on the 3mile course.

The Championship event incorporates 2 races in one. The Borough Championships – 33 Boroughs of London field teams of 6 runners in each age category, with the first 4 runners to score and then there's the British Athletics road championships which features 12 regional teams from across the country, again 6 runners in each team in every age cat. For scoring purposes the London boroughs combine to be one London team. Each race with up to 270 runners.

This year we had 36 of our athletes competing for Bromley plus 4 athletes running for other Boroughs – we had **Alice Bunn** Bexley U13Girls, **Alex Martin** for Croydon U17M, Na**ihmah Mossi** for Ealing in the U17W race, and **Zacceus Kleman** for Lewisham in the U15B race.

Almost 50% of our athletes were first timers - very excited, very nervous team. We also had a new management team this year. So I'd like to give a big shout out to **Jay Galley** who has been the Bromley Team manager for the last 16 years – an incredible contribution. Grateful to Jay for all his hard work. Has made it as easy as possible for the new team leads. So as well as thanking jay for the last 16 years, Id like to thank our new team managers – **Sam Aldridge** and myself looking after our U13s, **Karen Stanley** and **Liz Bunn** looking after the U15s and then **Lucy Starvis** and **Andrew Tutt** looking after our U17s. Also need to shout out to **Mike Crossan**, new trustees, but was a great help to me in the trials and in the prep for the main race, but wasn't able to be with us on the day as he had picked up a bit of an injury.

So to the racing. The day kicked off for us at 8.40 with the U17men. It was an incredibly close race, 3 out front, then a very large pack that closed in super fast down the Mall. First 3 home for us were our Triple J's. First for the Boroughs and 3rd overall was **Joe Scanes** in a PB of 7.23, Right on his heels was **Jed Starvis**, Running in his final MM, keeping his best for last, taking 3rd in the Borough champs and 7th overall with an almost 30sec PB in 7.25 Just 10seconds back was **Joseph Hill**, running 7.35 another big PB to take 5 th in the Borough comp and 25 th in the UK champs. Next home was **Ben O'grady**, with a 20second pb in his 3 rd MM, then **Oliver Ward** and **Nathan Clark** both competing in MM for the first time and **Alex Martin** continuing his comeback from injury, 4th scorer for Croydon in his 2 nd MM running with almost 20sec PB. Our Bromley team came first in the Borough champs and London took the win in the UK champs. Cracking start!

Next up was the U15 boys, Our team came 4th in the Borough champs with London taking  $2^{nd}$ =. First home for Bromley was **Daniel Horgan**, running in his 3rd MM and who had the



privileged start wristband for the first time. Daniel finished 8 th in Borough comp, with a 40 second PB. 2nd and 3rd home for us was **Johnny Lee** and **James Bunn** who both finished on 8.39 Almost a minute's PB for Johnny. It was 2nd time at MM for **Jake Martin** who had a strong run along with first timers **Ricardo Cervera- Tomlins** and **Zac Freeman** (late call up) Hope they enjoyed the experience.

Then to our U13 boys, possibly the feistiest startline of all the races. 5 of the 6 of our team were running for the first time, but it was our 2nd timer **Tiago Maia-Gibbons** who was first home for Bromley in a fantastic 3rd , just 8 seconds back in 8th place was **Emery Aldridge** Just a little further back was **Zach Evans** in 18th , supported by **Dexter** in 35th , **Akul** in 39th and **Billy** completing the team. Team finished 2nd overall in Borough champs and London silver in the UK champs. Huge well done to the U13s.

Moving to the ladies. At 9.01 it was the turn of the U17W, Team finished in 5th in the Borough comp, but the ladies took first prize in the 'giving your team manage a headache competition' !! Joking of course. But Andrew is looking for a different team for next year. First home for Bromley, running in her 5th MM was **Luciana Smith** taking 10th in the B comp in a time of 9.18, next home was **Kyla Dervish** in 9.56 finished 34th in her final MM along with **Megan Barlow** who running in her 6th and final MM. **Naimah Mossi** was 34th and the first finisher for Ealing, running in her 5th MM. Then all finishing very close together we had **Jasmine Mahoney** in 10.16, **Niamh Stanley** in 10.35 and **Leah Kyriacou** in 10.41 equal to her time from last year.

Switching to the U15 Girls, finished in 7th, first home, also first home last year was **Alba HY** in 19th place in the B comp. Running over 20sec PB.
