A new season of vets league action got underway with a home fixture at Norman Park.

Along with the old faces there were some new team members, a new womens team manager and a renewed sense of optimism that both teams could build on last season when the Men finished 4th and the Women's team finished 2nd overall and made the finals.

On the track the night started with a dominant win for new Women's Team Manager **Sam Williams** in the W35 A String in a seasons best 63.2secs whilst in the B string race **Daniela Sage** also ran a SB 70.4 to secure 2nd place.

There was a close finish in the W50 event, where **Jennie Butler** was just edged into 2nd place by 0.3 of a second, but there was no such drama in the W60 event where the evergreen **Helen Godsell** won by over 10 seconds from her competitors.

On the men's side, **James Burton** was able to shave a second off his PB whilst finishing 4th in the M35 A String race with a time of 57.7 secs.

lain Nye made his debut for the club, with his first race over the distance in the B string race finishing 3rd in a very impressive 58.9 secs. The other **lan (Firla)** also finished 3rd in the M50 race.

In his last year in the age group, there was an M65 club record for **Clem Leon** who crossed the line in the M60 race in a time of 68.6 seconds - well done Clem!

It was the 3000m for the distance runners and there were a string of impressive performances across both teams. **David Adams** ran a new PB of 9:30.8 whilst finishing 3rd in the M35 A String race, and in the B string race another club debutant, **William Senbanjo** also ran a PB to finish 2nd, crossing the line in 9:41.8. Similarly, **Luca Ercolani** was 2nd in the M50 race in a PB time of 10:10.5.

On the women's side, **Trang Nguyen** overcame traffic on the roads and on the track to register a PB of 11:21.0 for a 4th place finish in the W35 A string race, whilst there was seasons best for **Sarah Belaon** who also finished 4th in the B string race.

Finally a seasons best was also good enough for **Carole Coulon** to secure the win in the W50 race.

In the field, the Pole Vault was the first event to start and the last to finish on the night with both mens and womens events running concurrently. Sadly we had no representatives on the women's side, however the Men had **Roger Platt** (M50) and **Alan Hardy** (M65) both dropping down an age group but faring very well against their younger counterparts. Roger cleared 3.10m to finish 2nd, and Alan jumped 1.90m, the same height as two athletes above him, however ended up finishing 4th on countback.

Elsewhere in the field, there was a win in the M35 long jump for **Ashley Reid** with a best of 5.41m, and despite only having time for 2 attempts due to his commitments in the 400m, **Ian Firla** jumped 4.43m to secure 4th place in the M50.

Later in the womens event, there were 3rd places for both **Daniela Sage** (W35) and **Jennie Butler** (W50) - the latter jumping a PB of 3.24m.

We weren't able to field an athlete in either the W60 or W70 shot put so the final field event was the mens and womens discus. **Ian Firla** (M50), once again demonstrated his versatility finishing 5th in the M35 event, which was the same position **Simon Tolson** managed in the M50. There was another 5th placed finish for **Sam Williams** in the W35 and in the W50 **Carole Coulon** threw a PB 11.65m to finish 3rd.

Overall both the mens and womens teams secured a total of 48 points each, both finishing 3rd on the night. However with a string of strong performances, particularly on the track and with more of our specialist events to come over the next few fixtures there is plenty to build on and it should be an exciting season ahead.
