In the 100m u15 girls we had Matilda Murray have a strong race, as well as Zamaia Dixon who again ran very well. We also had Maya Conell and Omasan Okoro who both displayed incredible performances.

The 200m u15 girls followed up shortly was led by Noelle Carr and India Ellington who both had an amazing race! With both of the athletes almost running at their bests.

Next up was the 300m u15 girls, with Kara Bryan and her blistering speed ended up running a pb of 41.21, with Freya following up with another superb race almost beating her previous standing pb

Next up was 800m u15 girls, we had Eva John and Aoife Stanley both having solid races securing important team points!

For the u13 girls 800 was had jasmine Steven's and Olivia king both running well!

We then had Chloe Morez who dominated her race into first place with a pb of 2:34. To follow up we had melody who ran another superb race!

With Leela following up with a new pb of 1.30, and for the u13 high jump, after performing well in the 800, Jazzy stepped up and managed an impressive first place!, with Pearl also debuting in the YDL, well done to all girls!

In the shot put we had Isla Wilson and Eva John both earning valuable points for the team, and for the u13 we had sprinters Faye and Isabel throwing well! followed up with Isla again and Dulcie Simpson both scoring valuable points from discus and hammer for the squad. Isla managed a pb in discus and hammer! The last field of the day we had Freya Pierson and Harriet Hughes's both stepping up for the team in these events to score us more valuable points! With the u13s having Jasmine Steven's completing her 3rd event of the day with Isabel both gaining decent distances.



To end this fantastic day, we saw the u13 girls do the 4x100 relay where the girls performed to the best of their abilities it was a very close race with 1 and 3 all placing within a second.

The 4x100 u15 girls was again another blistering race with only 3 seconds between 1st and last place! Well done girls!

**U13M** – report from Team Manager (Kate Hunstone)

Saturday 4th May – scorching sun, swirling winds, and some seriously impressive performances. Well done to all the boys who competed at the first YDL meet of the season – for many it was their debut, and what a way to start! Despite the sun and windy conditions, the team pulled together, racking up PBs, points, and loads of great memories helping take our Lower Age Group team to 2nd place at Woodford Green.

<u>Hurdles</u>: We opened the track with the 75m hurdles – a tough technical event, but the boys delivered:

- Freddie ran a PB of 13.45s to take 2nd in the A string on debut
- Drew tackled his first ever hurdles race with courage and came 3rd in the B string with 16.10s brilliant effort!

Sprints: We kicked off with the 150m, and it was a great start.

- A string Jonathan delivered, finishing 2nd in 19.63 despite barely making it to the track in time impressive composure and a fantastic debut over the distance
- B string Calum took 3rd with a determined run of 20.11, just shy of his PB

The 75m saw more standout runs:

- A string Calum powered to 3rd in a swift 10.36
- B string Rohan clocked 10.47 for 4th in a competitive field

In the non-scoring races, we had a double win:

- Oscar stormed to 1st in 10.25 on a debut to 75m a brilliant PB
- Jonathan, in his first ever 75m, took 1st in 10.56, running into a strong headwind great effort!

<u>Middle Distance</u> - In the 800m, the boys really dug deep:

• A string – George ran a solid 2:33.94 for 4th



- B string Anthony stepped up last minute from non-scoring and smashed it with a PB of 2:29.13, taking 1st in his YDL debut!
- NS A string Fletcher impressed on debut, finishing 2nd in 2:44.87
- NS B string Ethan gave it a go despite not having raced 800m before and ran a respectable 2:53.00

The 1200m boys continued the momentum:

- A string Zach controlled the race brilliantly to take 1st in 3:48.14 a brilliant debut to the 1200m event
- B string Harry matched the result with a strong 1st in 3:53.67 great teamwork!

Jumps - In the long jump, both boys jumped solidly for the team:

- A string Freddie landed a 3.85m for 6th
- B string Fletcher jumped 3.48m for 4th, continuing his strong day

The high jump saw some brave performances:

- A string Freddie was superb on debut, clearing 1.35m to finish joint 3rd
- B string Zach stepped in to fill the empty spot and jumped 1.25m to claim 3rd great versatility!

Throws - In the shot put:

- A string Oscar matched his Kent League PB with a solid 7.67m, taking 3rd
- B string George added almost half a metre to his PB with a 4.74m throw for 4th great progress!

In the javelin:

- A string Zach launched it 16.06m for 6th
- B string Ethan threw 13.19m to take 3rd showing real strength across events

## Relays

We ended the day on a high:

• The 4x100m team of Rohan, Oscar, Calum, and Jonathan flew to 1st place in a blistering 52.41 – electric handovers and pure speed!

Huge well done to everyone – especially those trying new events, stepping up last minute or making their YDL debuts. The team spirit and performances made us super proud.

Just wanted to say a massive well done to everyone who competed at the YDL on Saturday – another extremely hot day - some brilliant performances and a real show of team spirit across the board.

The day kicked off with the hammer – up until the morning we didn't have anyone in the event, but Luca stepped up and threw 8m to grab us some valuable points. A great start and top team effort.

Jack and Alex followed with strong runs in the 80m hurdles – both just missing out on 1st place but taking excellent 2nd place finishes. Great racing from both.

Piers had an outstanding day, storming the 200m A string in 22.28 to go No.1 in the country. Jericho backed it up brilliantly, winning the B string in 23.56. A fantastic double – and brilliant to watch.

Over in the pole vault, Jack Ruby made his debut and took the win in the A string with a fantastic 3m clearance – great to see!

In the 800m, Jack, Johnny, Alex and Ben all raced well. Ben stepped in last minute due to illness and smashed it – winning the NS string with a new PB. Alex held his own in a competitive race. Jack continued his great run of form with a new PB of 2:10.24 to take 3rd in the A string. Johnny ran a smart, well-paced race and came through strongly to win the B string in a new PB of 2:13.82.

In the long jump, Sylvester stepped in last minute due to illness and jumped a solid 4.86m for 3rd place – a real team player. Luca also competed and got himself a PB of 2.43m – great work from both.

Aathi had a brilliant day in the throws – he threw 29.91m in the javelin and secured 4th place in the A string alongside Ben throwing a great 19.95m in the B string.

Aathi also won the A string discus with a new PB of 37.04m and put in a strong shot put too. Oliver also looked strong, taking 2nd place in both the discus and shot with a new PB of 25.11m in the discus and 9.58m in the shot – great consistency.

Jack and Jacob competed in the high jump – Jack secured the A string win and Jacob cleared 1.35m in the B string. Solid performances all round.

The 100m saw Piers, Nico, Sylvester and Luca compete. Piers was dominant again, cruising to the A string win. Nico, running a year young, held his own really well in the B string. Sylvester grabbed a new PB in the NS race, and Luca had a solid run in a quick heat – great effort from the whole group.

Jericho took on the 300m A string and powered through for the win – another confident, strong run. Finn followed in the B string, looking composed and finishing well.



In the 1500m, James and Jake ran well in the heat. Jake stepped in last minute due to illness in the team, and both gave it everything. James finished 2nd, just missing a PB, and Jake wasn't far behind with a new season's best.

We wrapped things up with the relays – always great to watch. The 4x100m team of Piers, Sylvester, Nico and Jack had a strong race, coming 2nd just behind Woodford Green. Some slick running and really promising for their first time together.

In the 4x300m, Finn, Jake, Johnny and Jericho took 3rd place. Finn started it off well in the 1st leg, Jake ran well despite tired legs from the 1500m, Johnny put in a cracking leg, and Jericho brought it home in style as always.

Really proud of how everyone performed – especially those who stepped in last minute or took on new events to help the team. Brilliant attitude all round.
