#### NAL – report from Nick Brooks

A great turnaround in match two of the NAL at Stevenage saw BBHAC finish in 2<sup>nd</sup> place behind the host club. We would have won the match convincingly, but our officials were seriously stretched between this match and a young athletes match elsewhere meaning we did not gain our maximum number of points on offer. Nevertheless this was a fantastic team effort and the team spirit was superb, our destiny may not be in our hands but we can improve a little on this match at home next week we can't do any more

Anyway there were some great performances as the team rallied behind captains Dan Putnam and Annie Davies who led the way, with Dan winning the B string 100m, winning the A string 400m, anchoring the sprint relay team to a huge win, and for good measure volunteering to cruise around the B string 4 x400m mixed relay to gain even more points. Annie won the sprint hurdles, ran the 100m, threw the shot and anchored the sprint relay.

Daniel Goroila took a great double winning both the 110m hurdles and the 100m, Louis Palmer only just got pipped in the 200m with Bailey Marks-Belaon winning the B string, Tommy Owler won the B string







400m, was also a non scorer in the 200m but was faster than anybody else, and ran a brilliant bend in the sprint relay. Jack Kavanagh ran from the front in the 3,000m gradually building the pace off and dropping everybody for a huge winning margin, running sub 2 minutes for his last 800m. Tony Chineudu won the B strong 400m hurdles and captured 2<sup>nd</sup> B string in the 110m hurdles.

In the field it was great to see Kelechi Aguocha competing again and he won the high jump and was easily persuaded to compete in the triple jump for the first in many years and took a well-earned second with Pat Apantaku winning the B string event and the B string shot and for good measure competed in the hammer. In the pole vault there were wins for Oscar Witcombe and Roger Platt. Good to see Dillon Claydon back as he won both the shot and the discus, and Aryan Padaruth threw a mighty 68.34m to win the javelin by 8 metres. Abrahim Sharif won the long jump by a huge margin with a leap of 7.43m only just missing out on the European qualifying mark and probably the best performance of the day. The men won their side of the match by 73 points with all this great scoring.

We picked up many more points because in this match we had our team managers and masters athletes filling in so well done to Ian Firla, Louisa Vallins, Duayne Bovell, Ashley Pearson and Sam Williams who competed in 4 events, who all stepped out of their comfort zone and amassed a ton of points that would otherwise have gone begging. Also, a big thanks to Harry Fage who went round in the 1500m having run a steeplechase earlier, and to Hannah Clark who had earlier run a strong 1500m only to get pipped on the line and then volunteering to run round the 5,000m for much needed points.

On the ladies' side where we competed, we did well but with no athletes in the steeplechase, high jump, and pole vault, and only one in the triple jump and a volunteer in the 800 and only one in the 1500m, we left many points on the table. Each time we don't field athletes we leave a minimum of 8 points behind and when you consider the ladies finished 5<sup>th</sup> but only 11 points behind 2<sup>nd</sup> placed Belgrave, you can see the importance of filling every space and we need to do this in the final match in Bromley where we have to win the match and hope Chelmsford come at best third and more than 50 points behind us, if we are to qualify for the final which is well within our capability.

Zara Obamakinwa's 55.26 discus throw was more than 18 metres ahead of anyone else for the thrower who was fresh from competing the European Team Championships. Mary Adeniji won the ladies long jump by a big margin and took 2<sup>nd</sup> in the triple jump. Chanelle Cole having run a good 100m earlier and later won the B string 400m, while Gemma Vickery took 2<sup>nd</sup> in the hammer and last years club President Ashley Pearson took 3<sup>rd</sup> in the B



string event. Amber Bloomfield won the B string 100m hurdles, and there was a first (B) and second (A) in the javelin for Joyce Nzekwe and Tallulah Ndikanwu who also performed in the hurdles and long relay, another great individual effort. Joyce also took 2<sup>nd</sup> in the A string shot with Annie winning the B string. The ladies took 3<sup>rd</sup> in the spring relay and combined well with the men to gain 2<sup>nd</sup> place in both mixed 4 x 400m relays.

We also welcomed new boys Louis Palmer and Sam Parsons representing the club for the first time, and hope that Clayton Jacinto's injury was only a niggle.

So, all to compete for in the final match at Norman Park on 19<sup>th</sup> July 2025.

Saturday's Kent League meet in Gillingham was certainly one to remember and not just for the performances! A stressful start saw several field event times rescheduled without warning, resulting in some athletes unfortunately missing their events. Add in late starts, an air ambulance arrival, and some wet, and windy weather, it was a challenging day for everyone.

But, despite it all, the team stepped up brilliantly with some standout performances. Here's a quick recap:



#### Field Events & Hurdles

The high jump got underway with Luke and Oscar in action. Unfortunately for Luke, the starting height was set at 1.25m, a tough opener and despite three solid efforts, he was just short of a clearance. Oscar came close to a new PB and showed good form after rushing to get there due to the change in start time. Sadly, Jericho was unable to compete due to the sudden schedule change.

With Jake Maloney unable to compete in the hurdles due to injury, Alex stepped up in the A-string for his first race back from injury and ran brilliantly. He looked calm, controlled, and strong throughout. In the B-string, Luca grabbed 3rd place with a new PB of 14.7, before heading straight over to the hammer where he earned more points for the team, excellent commitment from both boys!

Luke also took on the shot put, facing the new 3kg weight for the first time. He gave it his all and picked up vital points for the team. Evan was in the A-string and, while not quite finding a PB this time, still performed well in tough weather conditions, always giving 100% this followed through with the Hammer & Discuss, showing solid performances. Luca joined him in both events, stepping up again for the team, gaining those all-important points which helped us get the win on the day!

### Sprints & Jumps

After a long wait in the rain, the 100m boys were finally on. Nico, Zachary, and Ashley all raced hard and stayed focused despite the delays.

In the long jump, Zach P landed a new PB with 4.80m, and Sid was just behind with 4.78m, Ashley jumping strong and then rushing over to the 4x100 relay all showing consistency and quality in the runway.

Matthew, Oscar, and Jesse showed impressive energy and determination in the 300m after waiting nearly an hour in poor weather. All three ran well, with Oscar grabbing a fantastic new PB of 40.2s.

## **Distance & Relays**

The 1500m was delayed by another hour, but our distance boys stayed composed. Finn ran a smart, well-paced race and finished strong, followed closely by Jake with a solid performance. Later in the day, Jean-Paul took on his first competitive 1500m and looked strong and composed throughout.

To close the day, our relay teams brought the energy. In the 4x100m, Ashley got us off to a flying start, Zachary pushed hard on leg 2, Nico handled the bend perfectly, and Sylvester powered home for a strong 2nd-place finish.

The 4x300m team was just as impressive:

- \* Jericho flew through the final 300m to secure 3rd place

### YDL UAG

An impressive win for the Club in the 3<sup>rd</sup> YDL UAG event. Results are not yet published on the website but I understand we scored 695 points for 1<sup>st</sup> place, with 2<sup>nd</sup> going to Harrow on 634 points. Draft results are in the table below, showing the club topping the overall table by over 300 points, having won all 3 meetings!

In terms of women's highlights, pride of place goes, again, to Izzy Rae who not only improved her own League U17 80mHurdles record but did so with a time that broke the National record (and all in a downpour)! Emilia Adese was once again over 15m in the U17 shot, an encouraging performance before this week's English Schools Championships. In fact the U17 women were impressive across the board winning both strings of the 300, 800, 1500s/c, 80m hurdles, shot and discus plus the 4x300m relay and the 4x100m relay in a time that takes them to the top of the National club rankings. Special mention also for Jackie Nzekwe who won all three of her throws (A hammer and B discus and javelin). In the U20s, the standout performance was Eliza Nicholson in the 1500 in a time of 4.37.
