Dina Asher-Smith opened her indoor season with a 7.18 in the women's 60m in the Corky Classic in Texas (AW)

England Athletics Combined Event and Walking Championships, Incorporating the Indoor Para Championships. – Report from Shaun Lightman.

Ethan Hunstone competed in the U13 1k National Walks Championship at the English Institute of Sport, Sheffield. He led from start to finish, being challenged by H. Richards all the way except for the last lap and a half, completing 1k. In a PB and club indoor record of 5m 19.71. **Florence Watson** in the U17 3k had a race-long battle with an Irish girl, getting the better of her in the last 1k. In the English championship, she finished first in 16m 59.67, 2 secs outside her PB.

Nehemiah Dick also competed in the Para Ambulant Shot Put final, winning Bronze despite still being a junior, with a season's best throw of 8.84m.

Kent Schools Cross Country Champs – report from Paul Austridge

The English schools cross country championships is the highlight of the schools winter races and very tough selection to qualify.

Kent, one of the strongest counties in the country, select eight from each age group, junior, inter and senior, boys and girls. The Kent schools at Dartford was the first selection race with the top 4 auto qualifying. The top 20 were also invited to represent Kent in the upcoming schools intercounties, where a further two will be selected, leaving two places at the discretion of the selectors! The year sevens have their own race and reward for their successes is a year seven intercounties race later in March.

Our senior boys were impressive with three qualifying automatically, with Joe placing 1st, Jed 2nd and Joseph 3rd. Ben was way up the field but took a fall but still managed to finish a strong 8th with Nathan just behind in 9th. Good to see Ryan AS back racing.

In the senior girls Luciana auto qualified with her fine 3rd. A strong run from Kyla in 5th backed up by good runs from Niamh and Lily B.

Big turnout in the inter boys with Kian gaining auto selection in 4th, Madalitso placing a fine 5th and Johnny, a year young just behind in 6th. Great strength in depth and good runs from James S, Ricardo, Patrick, Benj, JP, Teddy and Matthew.

Good numbers in the inter girls saw Evie have a great run and earn selection for the English schools in a fine 3rd. More strength in depth from the squad with good runs by Aoife, Freya P, Rowan, Charlotte and Ariana.

In the junior girl Jazzy secured a place in the English school team with a fine 3rd. Great runs from Holly AS in 9th and Stella in 14th and more squad members running well in Alice, Imogen, Leela and good to see Freya D racing again.

The junior boys was an exciting race and saw Zach finish a super 3rd, with Dexter a great 4th, both gaining auto selection with Tiago finishing a strong 5th. Loads of the squad backing up well with Akul, Billy, Oscar, Edward, Josh, Haydn and Victor.

In the year seven girls race Louisa had a great run placing a high 10th.

Great to see our year 7 boys packing out the front end with a fantastic victory for Luc in 1st, Jacob having a superb run in 3rd, George a strong 4th and Anthony just behind in a great 5th. Good to see Fletcher running well and Alex D racing.
